NOTICE OF MEETING TO VOTE ON TAX RATE

A tax rate of \$0.0000 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of Western Texas College.

PROPOSED TAX RATE: \$0.0000 per \$100

NO-NEW-REVENUE TAX RATE: \$0.3305 per \$100

VOTER-APPROVAL TAX RATE: \$0.3602 per \$100

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2026 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for Western Texas College from the same properties in both the 2025 tax year and the 2026 tax year.

The voter-approval rate is the highest tax rate that Western Texas College may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that Western Texas College is not proposing to increase property taxes for the 2026 tax year.

A PUBLIC MEETING TO VOTE ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON 08/24/2026 12:30 PM (CT) at Western Texas College Boardroom, 6200 College Ave, Snyder, TX.

The proposed tax rate is also not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, Western Texas College is not required to hold an election to seek voter approval of the rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of the Western Texas College Board of Trustees of Western Texas College at their offices or by attending the public meeting mentioned above.

The 86th Texas Legislature modified the manner in which the voter-approval tax rate is calculated to limit the rate of growth of property taxes in the state.

The following table compares the taxes imposed on the average residence homestead by Western Texas College last year to the taxes proposed to be imposed on the average residence homestead by Western Texas College this year.
